

INS and ASSBI Award Descriptions

- **INS Awards**

1. **Nelson Butters Award** - The Society has established an award to honor the contributions of Dr. Nelson Butters and to recognize the impact he has had in the area of training. The prize will be awarded to the best research presented by a post-doctoral fellow. The prize will be given annually at both meetings (North American and Mid Year) and will include an honorarium of \$500.00 USD. This is an award only -- no travel support/reimbursement is included.
2. **Laird S. Cermak Award** - The Society has established an award to honor the contributions of Dr. Laird Cermak and to recognize the impact he has had in the area of memory and memory disorders. The prize will be awarded to the best research presented in the area of memory or memory disorders. The prize will be given annually at both meetings (North American and Mid Year) and will include an honorarium of \$500.00 USD. This is an award only -- no travel support/reimbursement is included.
3. **Phillip M. Rennick Award** - The Society has established an award to honor the contributions of Dr. Phillip Rennick and to recognize the impact he has had in the area of neuropsychology. The prize will be awarded to the best research presented by a graduate student. The prize will be given annually at both meetings (North American and Mid Year) and will include an honorarium of \$500.00 USD. This is an award only -- no travel support/reimbursement is included.

- **ASSBI Awards**

1. **Kevin Walsh Award** – ASSBI established the Kevin Walsh award in recognition of the contribution made by Kevin Walsh to establishing clinical neuropsychology in Australia. This award is given to the best oral research presentation by a Masters or Honours student and is valued at \$750 AUD
2. **The Luria Award.** The Luria award is named in honour of the great Russian neuropsychologist Aleksandr Romanovich Luria and is awarded to the best oral presentation by a Doctoral or PhD student. It is valued at \$750 AUD
3. **The Travel Award.** The travel award is provided in order to support a student finance travel to the conference. This award is open to any student submitting a presentation to the conference and is based on the quality of the abstract. This prize is also worth \$750 AUD
